As 6th Years settle into their final year in Loreto College Foxrock, we are committed to supporting our students to continually reflect on their learning as they work towards reaching their potential in the Leaving Certificate exams. I am therefore writing to you to share how we will assess and report on your daughter's academic progress over the course of the year ahead.

6th Year Assessments and Reports

Reporting about your daughter's progress will be ongoing throughout the year and will help you and your daughter to understand and discuss learning.

Students are also supported to monitor their own progress, both in class with their subject teachers and independently.

To further support your daughter in managing her learning, all 6th Year parents are requested to sign all class tests.
